

Professor Sergio Timerman was born in São Paulo, SP, Brazil on December 28, 1957 He graduated Faculdade de Medicina da Fundação Universitária do ABC, Santo André, São Paulo, Medical School in 1982. He accomplished his Cardiology fellowship at Dante Pazzanese Institute of Cardiology, São Paulo, in 1986. He is certified for: Internal Medicine, Cardiology, Emergency and Critical Care Medicine. He has been working in Dante Pazzanese Institute of Cardiology since 1986 and from April 1999 till now he is the Director of Resuscitation Research Department and the Emergencies Medical Training of Heart Institute (InCor), São Paulo. He has also been working at Albert Einstein Hospital, First Attendance Unit from 1987 to 1999. He received his PhD from Sao Paulo University, School of Medicine. Prof. Timerman, for first introduced in Brazil the BLS (with Healthcare Provider, Heartsaver AED, CPR for family and friends, Heartsaver

Guide and Plus, CPR ABC, CPR in School, Heartsaver FACTS - provider and instructor courses -American Heart Association); ACLS (provider and Instructor - AHA); PALS (provider and instructor -AHA); ACLS- EP (provider and instructor course - AHA); EHAC (Chest Pain Center Society), and in 2002 the National safety Council education program. He presently serves as an AED, BLS, ACLS, PALS, EHAC, ACLS-EP provider, instructor and instructor trainer. Additional, he was elected and served as a President of the Interamerican Heart Foundation. Nowadays; he is the President of South America Chapter from Florida Emergency Medicine Foundation. Moreover, he served as a President of the National Committee on Resuscitation of Brazil and Vice-President of the Brazilian Emergency Medicine Society. He is the Director of: the Emergency Department from The Brazilian Society of Cardiology, the Resuscitation and Emergency Department Brazilian Society on Internal Medicine, Resuscitation Department Critical Care Society - Sao Paulo Chapter, the Vice-President of the Resuscitation Department Critical Care Society and the President of Latin American Council on Resuscitation. He is the Team Leader of the group that developed the PAD-AED – Guidelines -2000 and 2005 for the American Heart Association and Actual ILCOR (International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation). He is a member of the Board of Director and a General Coordinator of Urgency and Emergency - MoH Brazil. He started de School of Medicine and Health Science Anhembi Morumbi University - Laureate International University as a Dean. Today, he is the National Director of Medicine and Health Science Brazil - Laureate International Universities. His fields of main interest are: myocardial infarction, thrombolysis, emergency, heart failure, cardiac arrest and deffibrilation, critical care medicine, air transportation and clinical trials. He is an active speaker with participations every year in several cardiology meetings in Brazil, South America and USA. Prof. Timerman was the President of the 1st Interamerican Congress on Emergency in 1999 and participated as a coordinator for many Congress, Symposiums, and Courses. He participated in numerous conferences, symposiums, seminars and roundtables, home and abroad. He presented more than 400 oral communications in both National and International Meetings. He is the author of 27 chapters in Cardiology books and he organized 39scientific events. Prof. Timerman is an active member of 17 National and 17 International Medical Societies

including, Fellow American College of Cardiology, American Heart Association, European Resuscitation Council, American College of Physician and the European Society of Cardiology.
